POSITION OBJECTIVES

The 1st Coach of Football is an integral member of the St. Kevin's College football program. The position is the Lead coach of the Football program which encompasses students across the secondary school and competes in the APS Sport Program. The position will design and oversee the on-field coaching program for the 1st XVIII Football Team.
